Discover the dramatic story of Berwick-upon-Tweed

Did you know that the town of Berwick-upon-Tweed has changed hands between England and Scotland at least 13 times in its history?

Things are peaceful today but Berwick has had a dramatic history caught on the front line of battles, rebellions, wars and skirmishes.

Magnificent viewpoints reveal why Berwick's castle is on an ideal defensive site. Find out how successive rulers strengthened and expanded Berwick's defences.

Walk around the walls and see medieval, Elizabethan, Tudor and eighteenth century constructions. Find out how Berwick led the way with fortification design and weaponry.

This 3 mile self-guided walk takes you around one of the best-preserved fortified towns in Europe and is an unforgettable experience.
