Before that I worked as a youth and community worker and as a priest among women and girls on housing estates, inner-city streets, and country villages. Inequalities, especially through misogyny has been and still is rife, causing abuses of all kinds, spiritual emptiness, mental and physical ill health and suicide. Others working with me have had similar experiences, and we are building on our experience and expertise to make a difference to people's lives, whatever their gender and circumstances. Locally we are already seeing an empowering effect on some residents, including some men, who are relieved to discover 'Hilda House Community' It seems to have given hope for change.

We will measure this project on the day itself with a creative form for people to fill up, perhaps in small groups around a coffee before they leave if they wish to.
