Finally, we don't want to dwell on the bad stuff, but we must acknowledge that there have been a few instances where damage has been done to council property over the past month. Over the past week there has been a bin burning spree, including some at Five Arches and really sadly, the bear bin in the Osborne play park – this has been temporarily replaced with the frog from Flagstaff park.





There was also damage done to electrics on Spittal Promenade which affected the Splash Park – it can be really disheartening when these instances happen but the eagle eyes of the public have really helped to identify issues in the area. We also had an instance of people (adults!) drawing on a planter on Marygate with permanent pens - thank you to the member of the public who tried to discourage them and those who subsequently let us know about the damage which was cleared up by the wardens. They have also been dealing with a spate of graffiti in town and Northumberland County Council have been helping us deal with some that has appeared on a few of our benches. You may not be able to fix the cause but you can try to clear up after them!



### **Staffing News**

#### **New Picnic Tables**

We recently installed 2 new recycled plastic picnic benches outside Spittal playpark, both with space for a wheelchair or pushchair. We hope these will stand up well to the seaside weather as they are more robust than wood and should require less maintenance. We couldn't have done it without help from the Premier Building Team (below), who collected the made up tables, laid paving and completed the installation. We really value the relationships with local contractors in town and we hope to build on these more as we progress. Having skilled local people we can rely on to help with larger jobs is invaluable and so appreciated.



We are also going to install 7 benches within Spittal play park itself – these will be a fun bright blue colour, also in recycled plastic and will be a great addition to the town. Let us know what you think of them!

We try to recycle benches where we can to save money, an example this week is the benches now in position by Newfields pitch and by the Highcliffe Hill bus stop. These came from the old decommissioned skate park at Highcliffe and we are really pleased to be able to reuse them. We had the invaluable help of Fabvent to get this job done. They have assisted us with many projects in town, from making bus stops safe after vandalism, play park repair, removing benches embedded in concrete and this week have lifted the benches at St Helen's Terrace and fitted the replacements. Craig and the team are indispensable to us and another example of a great working relationship for our wardens.

## **Play Parks**

The trampoline at Flagstaff has been fixed, sadly the seesaw is now out of action but we are working on replacing that as soon as we can. It has been in place for around 8 years and whilst it had been repaired up to standard in the past, it is now due an upgrade.





The Newfields swing has also been fixed and put up again by Fabvent. We were informed at the end of August that toilet cleaner had been poured over the baby slide and trampoline in Spittal. This is very disappointing behaviour especially in an area where children play and we are really grateful to the public for letting us know so we could action the removal.

#### **Bins**

The wardens have replaced bins in various locations this month including sites on Billendean Terrace, Riverside Road, Farne Road and Five Arches. This is a reminder that dog waste can go in these black bins, there is an image of a dog on these so please look out for it (see below). The new recycled plastic wood effect bins for the high street on Marygate have arrived to replace the black ones currently there - these will be put out from October onwards once the area is less busy and the black ones will be used elsewhere where needed.





You may not know this but replacing bins is an expensive business, they are around £150 each including the base paving slab so we do try to look after them and reuse them where we can!

#### Seagulls

We have been informed that some people are feeding the seagulls in town - this can create big problems for those areas, encouraging gulls to approach people on the high street and becoming aggressive. It also, of course, means even more mess in town! Please try and discourage people from doing this if you see it, we will be putting up some signs in town regarding this soon.
